

Throughout the academic year, we come across students who confront unexpected distresses like accidents, loss of supporting family members, loss of family income due to the pandemic etc., which in turn can lead to acute financial difficulties.

We believe that students who have been through prolonged struggle and worked hard to get into IITM should not let go of this chance merely due to a lack of financial support. Hence, IITM has created an emergency fund called students distress fund; this fund has been supporting numerous students, easing their problems and helping them in focusing on their studies. The students are not required to repay the amount. It has been used for various purposes, majorly for laptops, room rent, academic fees, and health care expenses.


The following captures the total contribution and the bifurcation of the cost utilized against the causes.

As per the above-mentioned chart,

- Majority of the fund has been utilised by the students for procuring laptops to attend online classes and for academic purpose during the pandemic.
- The second major cause is room rent and Wi-Fi.
- Third major cause is for the academic fees, followed by medical expenses.

"Our only source of income is our mother, and she is a daily wage labour. We are three brothers; all are studying now. My aspiration is to get into NCC.
